WHITE WINES

ASSYRTIKO WINES:

Assyrtiko's most complex, elegant and age worthy grapes and wines are grown and made on the island of Santorini. Grapes are planted in volcanic rich soil giving the wine a citrus aroma with a unique earthy, mineral aftertaste.

MOSCHOFILERO WINES:

Moschofilero grapes have a gray colored skin and therefore produce a wine that is a blanc de gris. Its crisp character and beautiful floral aroma of roses and violets with hints of spices can be drunk as an aperitif or with food.

RED WINES

AGIORGITIKO WINES:

Agiorgitiko wines stand out for their deep red color and notable aromatic complexity. Agiorgitiko's soft tannins and balanced acidity lead to the production of many different styles of wine, ranging from fresh aromatic reds to extraordinary aged red. Agiorgitiko is cultivated in Nemea, where the higher the elevation, the better quality wine.

XINOMAVRO WINES:

The wines made from Xinomavro are known for their superb aging potential and their rich tannic character. Their complex aromas combine such red fruits as gooseberry with hints of olives, spices and dried tomatoes.

Karamoor, Fort Washington, Pennsylvania, 2013
Ripe Bing cherry, hints of bay laurel and earth fragrances, reminiscent of black trumpet mushroom, dominate the aromatics of Karamoor's top selling wine.
The aromatics open to flavors of concentrated black cherry, an essence of oak toast, and fresh herbs that carry to a soft, full-bodied finish.

75 Cabernet Sauvignon Sean Minor, Napa Valley, California, 2014
Cabernet is a full-bodied red wine with dark fruit flavors and savory tastes from

black pepper to bell pepper.
